#### **ABACUS**

Abacus Breakfast Club runs from 7.45am Monday to Friday, during term time. There is no need to book, just turn up after your initial registration. The children have a healthy breakfast such as toast, cereal, crumpets or bagels. There is also a special of the day which could be yoghurt, fruit and honey. Abacus provide a selection of table top games, such as air hockey or pool. Alongside this are board games and craft activities. Children can attend for one or five mornings a week, or just when required. The cost is £6.50 from 7.45am and £6.00 from 8.00am. The children are taken into school for the start of the school day. **Reception Start 2023:** If your child is due to start in Reception in 2023, please apply for a place as soon as possible. Please go to <a href="https://www.havering.gov.uk/admissions/primary">www.havering.gov.uk/admissions/primary</a>

#### **Key Messages**

**Free School Meals/Pupil Premium** – Although all children in Reception through to Year 2 do not have to pay for school dinners, if you are in receipt of benefits, you may be entitled to free school meals once your child goes into Year 3. By registering your entitlement now, you ensure that your child will receive free meals later on, even if your circumstances have changed by then. It also means that this school will receive extra funding called Pupil Premium which we can then use to support your child. So the sooner you apply, the better.

**On School Grounds -** Please <u>do not</u> use your mobile phone. Children are not permitted to ride their bikes or scooters once they have entered site. Please ensure your child walks into school and pushes their scooter/bike.

**Labelling of Items** – Please remember to put your child's name on all items they bring in to school. This includes hats, scarves, gloves, water bottles, book bags, etc.

**Absences** – please remember to <u>always</u> contact the office either by email (<u>office@langtons-inf.havering.sch.uk</u>) or by leaving a message on our absence line (telephone 01708 447 866) by <u>9am</u> on the first day of your child's absence. When leaving a message on the answerphone please clearly state your child's name, class and the specific reason for their absence. If your child is unwell, please specify whether this is because they have a cold, a temperature or are feeling sick, etc.

It is our duty to make contact with every parent whose child is absent to check that everything is ok and the family are not in an emergency situation needing assistance. If we cannot make contact, we may make a home visit to make sure everyone is ok.

**Emails** – when emailing the office, please <u>always include your child's full name and class</u>. This will help our office staff by cutting down on the time they have to spend looking up details.

We greatly appreciate your support as this helps us to free up time for other tasks.

# **Nursery News**

This week the children have been learning and talking about different types of homes. We have also been on an Autumn walk in the garden to find some fantastic Autumn treasures. The children loved using the magnifying glasses to have a closer look at what they found. We used some of the leaves we found to do some leaf printing.





The children have been working really hard to build their independence within the Nursery setting. They have been practising to put their coats on by themselves using the sit down method.







This week we continued with the introduction to Phonics, starting with Phase 1. The aim of Phase 1 is to develop the awareness of the sounds around them and to support their listening skills.

This week the children have enjoyed listening to sounds different animals make. Have a go at home asking your child to identify the sounds animals may make such as a cat, a dog, a snake, an elephant and many more.

Please could we ask for a family photo to support our family theme next week. These can be physical copies or emailed into the school office.

# Reception News

#### This week:

Wow! We had a great week at school, coming in every day. We met lots of new friends and learnt how to share the toys in our classroom. We are getting better at following our school day routines and learning to do things on our own. The middays have said that we are doing really well at lunchtimes and eating our food sensibly. This week we have been reading our topic book 'What makes me a me?' We listened to the story and made predictions about what might happen next. We shared pictures of our families and drew pictures of them. It was nice to share who is in our family. In maths we learnt how to count objects and match them to their value. We really enjoy exploring making different models using the construction materials. This week we made a bowling lane using the big waffle blocks. We have investigated using different natural materials to make our faces. This week in phonics we learnt the sounds s, a, t and p. You can read our Bug Club book, 'In a Pit', which contains our focus sound.

# Year 1 News

This week: In Maths we have practised Subtraction! We have used a number line to count back and also used objects such as cubes to help us.

In our Topic lesson we discovered a very strange mess left in the school hall! We used our whiteboards to write down all of the clues we could find. We were great detectives!





In our Art lessons we have been learning about a famous artist named Anne Geddes. She is a photographer who takes photos of babies and children. We have explored her work and had a go at practising some of her ideas ourselves!

In Phonics we have practised the diagraphs sh, ch and th. We have read a range of words such as, fish, chop, with and this.

To help your child recap on these sounds please read 'Fish & Chips'. This book has been allocated to you on Bug Club ©

## Year 2 News

**Topic:** This week in English we learnt the poem 'When I Was One'. We created a poem map and made up actions to help us recall it correctly.

In Art we looked at the work of Vincent Van Gough. We closely looked at his brush strokes and then we experimented with different techniques using water colours. Finally, we created our own version of 'Starry Night'.

**Maths:** We have been learning the names of shapes in maths this week. We are able to describe shapes using the terms straight, curved, vertices and sides. We used rulers to draw shapes, it was quite difficult to make sure the sides were the correct length and parallel. We also sorted shapes into a Venn Diagram using a range of criteria.



**Phonics:** We are learning *i* as in 'ink' and 'ice', *air* as in 'stair', *al* as in 'palm' and 'stalk' and *eigh* as in 'sleigh'. The Bug Club Book is 'Dino-Splashing'

We hope you enjoyed our singing at the Harvest Festival.
